Science - Electricity

To identify common appliances that run on electricity.

To construct a simple series electrical circuit, identifying and naming its basic parts, including cells, wires, bulbs, switches and buzzers

To identify whether or not a lamp will light in a simple series circuit, based on whether or not the lamp is part of a complete loop with a battery

To recognise that a switch opens and closes a circuit and associate this with whether or not a lamp lights in a simple series circuit

- Number - **Place Value**

Roman numerals, round to the nearest 10, round to the nearest 100, count in 1,000s, count in 1,000s, 100s, 10s and 1s, partitioning, the number line to 10,000, 1,000 more or less, compare 4-digit numbers, order numbers, round to the nearest 1,000, counting in 25s, negative numbers.
